The Executive Board of the Bucks County Consortium has established a scholarship opportunity to assist member municipalities to send employees who have not attended the annual APMM Conference. The Scholarship Award will be a reimbursement up to \$1,000.00 to offset the cost of registration, meals and lodging at the 2019 Annual APMM Conference, May 14 - 16, 2019 Spooky Nook Sports & the Warehouse Hotel.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A "First-Time-Attending" Bucks County Municipal Manager, Assistant Manager, Assistant to the Manager, Finance Director or Manager's Designee.
2. Must be a Consortium member, in good standing.
3. Recipient must agree to attend the June 6th consortium meeting and make a short presentation on what they learned at the conference.

TO APPLY:

Send a copy of your resume, a Letter of Interest explaining your desire, and limitations (if any,) in attending the Conference. If attending as a designee of the Municipality, a letter of Recommendation from the Municipalities Manger must accompany the application.
